We are delighted to be offering a new internship programme! We are currently looking for two passionate and dedicated interns to work with Bats without Borders and our partners (either the Wildlife and Environmental Society of Malawi (WESM) in Malawi or Copperbelt University in Zambia). These two posts will be based in Malawi / Zambia with online training and teamwork with other members of the Bats without Borders team and in-country partners.

About Bats without Borders

Bats without Borders was founded in 2013, as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) regulated by OSCR (the Scottish charity regulator). We work across southern Africa covering four main areas: applied research, conservation advocacy, engagement and capacity strengthening.

About the role

Bats without Borders is looking for two highly motivated individuals with a strong interest in making a difference in conservation. The successful applicants will get a unique opportunity to develop and grow their skills by getting on-the-job training (e.g. on bioacoustics, Geographic Information systems (GIS), data collection, management and processing). They will also gain invaluable experience in ecological research, conservation and community engagement. They will assist the BwB team with structured research and engagement activities, and will also have the opportunity to develop an independent mini-research project during their internship according to their own interests. There may also be opportunities for the interns to contribute to projects/activities led by Bats without Borders' in-country partners.

About you

This is the perfect opportunity for a recent BSc (hons) graduate or MSc postgraduate in biology, ecology, wildlife conservation, or equivalent. The ideal candidate should be able to demonstrate a strong background in ecology and conservation, a drive to contribute to applied ecological research, and a passion for biodiversity/bat conservation. They will be a well organised team player with good communication and IT skills.

In return, we offer hands-on research and conservation experience, training and mentorship opportunities, as well as learning of how an NGO operates. We will help you to develop the



skills and experience for your future career by providing mentoring, feedback and learning opportunities to support your professional development. By getting involved in research and engagement activities, you will also have the chance to actively contribute towards bat conservation.
