Bats without Borders is looking for a reliable, enthusiastic and confident volunteer Treasurer to join our Board of Trustees (unpaid position). The role is home-based but there may be an opportunity to occasionally meet up in central Scotland. The primary aim of this role is to maintain effective organisational governance, ensuring financial viability and making sure that proper processes and procedures exist for assuring all financial records and decisions are maintained and clearly demonstrate transparency and accountability.

This is an exciting opportunity to join the dynamic Board and support the Principle Officer and our ongoing work across southern Africa.

Availability and commitment

Board members need to be able to attend four board meetings per year, and to participate in the activities of the organisation between board meetings, to advise the operational team and be a Bats without Borders ambassador. Board meetings are currently held quarterly via Zoom.

This position would be for a period of three years (term can be renewed after this time).

About Bats without Borders

Bats without Borders was founded in 2013, as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) regulated by OSCR (the Scottish charity regulator). We work across southern Africa covering four main areas: applied research, conservation advocacy, engagement and capacity strengthening.

Our Vision

Bats and their habitats in southern Africa are valued, protected and conserved for the well-being of bats, biodiversity and people.

Bats without Borders is dedicated to conserving bats, biodiversity and healthy ecosystems within southern Africa's changing landscape. About the role

We are recruiting a Treasurer that will bring financial skills and experience, including budgeting and strategic financial planning, to the Bats without Borders team.

Key duties will include:

- overseeing financial aspects of the charity, on behalf of the Board of Trustees, to ensure its short and long-term viability
- keep clear, accurate records of the Bats without Borders financial transactions
- manage the budget, issue bills and organise receipts and payments of charity and volunteer expenses
- manage the bank account and restricted fund accounts in consultation with Principal
 Officer and the rest of the Board

- manage income from multiple income streams, including grants, donations, PayPal,
 Give as You Live, etc
- ensuring that funding received for specific purposes is separately accounted for and spent for the purposes for which it was given
- ensuring that the charity has adequate financial procedures and controls and that these are monitored and reviewed regularly
- presenting the Annual Accounts at the Annual General Meeting
- the accounts are independently reviewed, and working closely with the Principle Officer to submit them to OSCR (the Scottish Charity Regulator)

We are looking for an individual to help us successfully maintain financial control and ensure we comply with our legal responsibilities as a Registered Charity. If you are passionate and motivated to support a micro conservation charity to develop and grow, in order to expand our impact across southern Africa, we would love to hear from you!

- experience as treasurer or in a relevant financial management position
- knowledge of financial legislation and practices
- friendly and supportive approach to dealing with people

- experience of online finance software(e.g. Xero or Quickbooks)
- an interest in conservation and/or bats
- an understanding of charity governance
- experience of living/working in southern Africa
