About the role

In-country capacity strengthening of bat research, conservation and engagement across southern Africa is a key priority for Bats without Borders. The role will be divided between capacity strengthening (~40%), project support (~40%), and partnerships (~20%). Specifically, this role will be to support the capacity strengthening of early career ecologists, researchers and bat conservationists and bat group members. We have a number of existing and upcoming capacity strengthening initiatives that require on the ground support. This year we will be launching our early career training pipeline to provide early career individuals with key skills and knowledge to support their development. We are also launching a 'How to set up a bat group' training course to establish a network of bat groups across southern Africa. Finally, we have a highly successful funded Conservation Internship programme. This role will support partnership working, bat group development, and accelerate our early career-training pipeline (including Women in Bat Science) and Conservation Intern training programme.

Key responsibilities:

- to lead the development and implementation of Bats without Borders capacity strengthening strategic plan;
- support the establishment of a network of local bat groups across southern Africa;
 - to coordinate our early career pipeline, developing and (where required / appropriate) delivering training to early career ecologists, researchers and budding bat conservationists;
- explore capacity strengthening opportunities for the Conservation Internship programme;
 provide networking opportunities and support to early career ecologists;
 support the ongoing development of our Conservation Internship programme;
- support the development of key external capacity development partnerships for Bats without Borders;
- secure further funding for our capacity strengthening and Conservation Internship priorities; and
- working closely with the operational team to ensure the smooth running of the charity.

About you

We are looking for an enthusiastic, self-motivated and committed individual with excellent project management and communication skills. You will have a passion for capacity strengthening and a proven track record in organising and/or developing training and capacity support, partnership working and people development. We are lucky to work with a diverse range of people from different cultures and backgrounds, so an essential part of this role is to be respectful, supportive and culturally literate.
